

Did you know this?

Every year 7 million flower bulbs are planted by hand at Keukenhof.

As well as growing flowers, at Keukenhof we grow grass here too! Each year, we sow about 8.500 kilos of grass seed.

In total, Keukenhof has 15 kilometers walking paths.

There are 280 benches, 15 fountains, 360 rubbish bins and 32 bridges in the garden.
